International Forum to Focus on Expansion of Financial Services for All

Microentrepreneurs to be honoured by United Nations and celebrities

WHAT: The International Forum to Build Inclusive Financial Sectors, the closing event in New York of the International Year of Microcredit 2005 will be held from 7-9 November.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Panelists and speakers over the three day forum include Bill Clinton, Former U.S. President; Her Royal Highness Princess Maxima of the Netherlands; Paul Wolfowitz, President of the World Bank; Kemal Dervis, Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme; José Antonio Ocampo, Under-Secretary-General of the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs; Stanley Fischer, Governor of the Bank of Israel; Sir Nicholas Stern, Head of the U.K. Government Economic Service; Sir Ronald Cohen, Chairman of the Social Investment Task Force; and Diana Taylor, Banking Superintendent of New York.
- Discussions will centre on the changing profile of microfinance from charity to a profitable business opportunity that can benefit poor people, governments and investors alike.
