Speaking at a workshop or-mized by the Global Rights stemational and coordinated y Adamawa peace project and emocracy initiatives for orth-east zone, Innocent un'gba said electronic regis r would end rigging.

Daa'gba maintained that ectronic voters registers will event politicians from manacturing figures in order to in elections, bearing in mind at election tribunal can down ad from the internet the total imber of persons that regis-

ned in the area. He added, "this will add insparency to election tribuils and cases that are handled

The Yola based legal practiner argued that the issue of limitation of constituency is national matter and not subat to the control of the state d also that voters register is national item not subject to control of state, so the state ks the constitutional powers conduct elections using ma-ials its cannot produce for conduct of its elections

The Independency of such state electoral body even om the immediate past ex-rience in this country has own clearly that such a dy is not needed", he stat-Daa'gba further called for amendment of some of sections in the electoral in such a way that once a adidate is elected on the

platform of a particular politi or resign from the said party and join another party while still holding office in which he was elected under the said po-

He pointed out, "this is be-cause by section 221 of the 1999 Constitution, it is the political party that present candi-date for election. So it is humbly submitted that a candidate who takes benefit of a political party should be made not to abandoned the sponsor at least in the course of his tenure.

DUTSE-ABOUT one hundred and five wards representatives that include serving councillors in Hadejia local government area of Jigawa state have appeared before Shari'a court for alleged self-enrichment and siphoning of participatory expenditure management fund in their re-spective domain.

#### Councillors appear before sharia court over embezzlement

The presence of the 105 ward councillors in the shari'a court followed a series of petition written to the court by concerned indi-genes of Hadejia local council which led the court to summon them for necessary and proper explanation on the allegations levelled against them.

Last month concerned indigenes of Hadejia local council concluded arrangecouncil concluded arrangement to drag the council chairman. Alhaji Ibrahim Mohammed Jaga and his councillors to the Economicand Financial Crime Commission (EFFCC) for alleged diversion of N25million belonging to the council meant for polling unit areas.

Vanguard reports that the N50,000 participatory expenditure management fund

penditure management fund mostly being released to polling units across the state meant for development projects was said to have been diverted by the coun-cil chairman in collaboration with his council's representatives popularly known as (Yan goma). In a paper read by the po-

lice first information report at the court, the one hun-dred and five councillors have jointly collaborated with the council boss and siphoned the said amount

The Presiding judge of Hadejia shari'a court, Mal-lam Khadi Mohammed had after listening to the accu-sation asked the defendants whether or not they have di-verted the funds for their

personal uses. However, the accused 105 pleaded not guilty the case has been adjourned after sallah celebration to enable police continue with their investigation.

An eyewitness told our correspondent that trouble started when the farmer engaged the Fulanis in a hot argument

The owner of the farm, it was gathered, could no longer bear the invasion and had to accost the Fulanis duiring which a hot argument

nsued between them. The Fulanis in their characteristic manner brought out their daggers and other dangerous weapons to attack the farmer who is the owner of the plantation in contention.

During the scufle, the farm-er was killed and the Fulanis took to their heels leaving the corpse near a river.

After a thorough search, the lifeless body was found the following morning and the

The police immediately ung into action but did not lead to the arrest of the sus-pects and had to apprehend the parents of the suspected

Homicide detectives are now said to have swung into action towards tracking down the culprits who are still on

the run. State Police spokeman, ASP

Lawan Shinkat could not be reached for comments over the issue but a senior police officer at the police headquarters who craves anonymity confirmed the story and promised that those involved will be tracked down soon.

The State Govt just last week instituted a 10 man investigating panel to unravel the circumstances that led to the clash as a result of a similar problem and are mandat ed to determine the causes of such communal clashes and come out with a lasting solu-tions to the constant clashes.

MINNA-NINE stu dents of Federal Pol-ytechnic Bida, Niger State are among twenty suspect-ed armed robbers recently arrested by the Niger State Police Command. The sus-pects are said to have made useful statements to the police who are still investigating the case. The State Commissioner
